

Sacrament of Marriage - Please call Father Trinh at least six months before your wedding to begin preparations.

Sacrament of the Sick - Please call the Rectory at anytime for emergencies. The homebound are visited regularly by Father Trinh and the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. If you or a family member is hospitalized and would like a visit, please call the Rectory. Please call the Rectory, also, if you would like to be anointed before you are hospitalized.

Letters of Eligibility - Prior to your being a godparent at Baptism or a sponsor at Confirmation, you must receive a Letter of Eligibility from Divine Mercy Parish. You must be a registered parishioner who is at least 16 years of age, who has already received Confirmation, who comes to Mass on Sundays and Holydays, and, if married, is married in the Church. If you would like to get a current baptismal certificate or a current marriage certificate, please provide us the following information.;

- 1. An Original Copy of your Baptismal Certificate or Marriage Certificate. If you don't have this information, for Baptismal Certificate, please tell us what particular Church where you were baptized, since Divine Mercy Parish is the merge of Saint Clement Church, Saint Raphael Church, St. Vincent Church, Saint Irenaeus Church and Good Shepherd Church. Also provide us your date of birth, the date of your baptism, your full name, your father's name, your mother's maiden name and your god-parents' name. For Marriage Certificate, please tell us what particular Church where you were married, the date of your marriage, your full name, your parents' full names, your spouse's maiden name and your spouse's parents' full names.

THE JOY OF EASTER

My dear brothers and sisters, what happened if Jesus was not resurrected? If that was the case, we would had no hope, no joy and no direction for life. Here is a little story to demonstrate this point of view.


